### ***From the Rector***

It's July, time for fireworks, picnics, and most especially, time to celebrate the meaning of the Declaration of Independence and the freedom we enjoy as a nation. With freedom, of course, comes large responsibility, and that means we need not only to acknowledge those aspects of ourselves and our country that do not live up to the ideals expressed in the founding of this nation, but also to work to change those things.

Within the Church, we need to continue to live into the promises we have made in Holy Baptism, first of all to follow Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior. As disciples, we have promised to continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, the breaking of bread and the prayers. We have promised to persevere in resisting evil, and when we fall into sin, to repent and return to the Lord. We have promised to proclaim by word and example the Good News of God in Christ. We have promised to seek and serve all persons, loving our neighbor as ourselves. We have promised to strive for justice and peace among all people and to respect the dignity of every human being. *The Book of Common Prayer* pp. 292-294 & pp. 300-305

As followers of Jesus Christ, we give thanks for the liberties which are ours in the United States; we pray for those in our armed services; we pray for all the troubled places of the world; we pray for an end to hunger and the displacement of peoples; we pray for peace and prosperity for all people.

From July 7-17, the General Convention (GC) of The Episcopal Church (TEC) will meet in Anaheim, California. That meeting is concurrent with the Triennial Gathering of the Episcopal Church Women (ECW). I will be at GC as Deputy 4 in the clerical order—doesn't that sound official? Each diocese sends up to four lay and four clerical deputies, with the first alternate in each order, if possible. This will be my third time to represent the Diocese of Missouri at GC, and it's a tremendous privilege to be able to do so. (I did not expect to attend the 2009 Convention, as I was elected Deputy 6 two years ago; but both clergy ahead of me have left the diocese, so here I am . . .) Please welcome the Rev. Sally Weaver who will preach and celebrate July 5 & 12!

At the General Convention, we will discuss and vote on many—about 500—resolutions. These include TEC budget priorities; a national church health plan, which should result in direct savings for all congregations; additions to our liturgical calendar; evangelism; youth ministry; church leadership; and congregational vitality.

We will also address TEC's relationship to the Anglican Communion, although the much-touted Anglican Covenant is not in a form to be presented to the GC. Specifically, we will discuss 2006 last-day legislation, which included a moratorium on ordinations to the episcopate "of persons whose manner of life represents a challenge to the wider church" (B033-2006).

The intent of that resolution was to give our Presiding Bishop a way to engage effectively other primates of the Anglican Communion who were furious with TEC, but that effort has failed. The consensus among priests and lay persons of your Missouri deputation is that the current TEC national canons (rules) are sufficient to determine who may or may not be ordained a bishop.

When our deputation returns, we will meet with people around the diocese to share what we learned and did at the GC. We take with us what was said in the listening sessions held in June. Please pray for the Church, and for the GC, that we may live out our baptismal covenant, listening to and responding to the Holy Spirit, however frightening it may be to take that kind of risk. I now quote my friend, the Rev. Jason Samuel, Clerical Deputy 5 (alternate):

***The church does not need protecting; it needs to be called, renewed, and filled with the Spirit to lead us into mission. As St. Paul reminds us, ' . . . we are to live no longer for ourselves, but for him who died and rose again for our sake.' 2 Cor.5:15***
